# **Summer School Registration Guidelines**

#### **Program Registration:**

Summer School registration will take place online through the CAP website. Direct Link <a href="here">here</a>. Summer school is separate from CAP. CAP is only assisting in the registration process. Please use this catalog to help guide your registration of classes. There is also an online version of this catalog sent out to all CSD families through Skyward Messenger and on the Summer School sign up page after an account has been created.

The Summer School registration window will be open Monday, April 3rd and will close Friday, May 26th.

- All families will need to create an account in order to register for classes.
  - If an account has already been created through CAP, families need to use that account to sign up for Summer School. Please do not create a new account.

Please be aware some summer school classes have a maximum number of students. Classes will close once they have reached the maximum number of students. Parents can add students to a waiting list if the class is full.

To ensure your student is enrolled in the classes they would like, register as early as possible. Late registrations may not have all classes available to them due to classes filling maximum capacity.

Any student that desires to enroll in the Summer School program after the registration date will have to enroll in courses where there are available openings. This means a student may not get to be in the classes they may want.

If your student has been requested for Summer Learning Academy courses, or Jump Start courses, and the family has indicated their student will participate in those courses, families need to register their student(s) for those recommended courses before any other courses.

Registration tutorial videos are available online for any assistance in the registration process.

#### **Summer School Schedule:**

The summer school program runs from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. each session at the elementary school, SLC, and/or the high school. The daily program schedule is divided into four instructional sessions with each session lasting one-hour, which means that a student may enroll in as many as four different course offerings per session. Special information about course requirements and special circumstances are listed in the Course Offerings section.

#### **Program Participation:**

The summer school program is open to any current Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 12 child who resides within the boundaries of the School District of Cambridge as well as open enrollment students to the School District of Cambridge. Any child who will be attending Kindergarten in the fall of 2023 is eligible to participate in the Pre-Kindergarten class. In order to be eligible to take this course the child must turn five by September 1, 2023.

#### **Program Regulations and Attendance:**

Summer School Attendance Line-It is very important to notify the elementary office if your child will be absent. Phone number 608-423-9727.

All students are expected to attend ALL summer school classes that they are enrolled in. Students should not be enrolled in summer school classes if they will be absent for more than 5 days in either session. Students may be excused for the following reasons:

- Family Vacations
   Illness
- 2. Summer camps or clinics 5. Family Emergency
- 3. Church camps or schools 6. Absences approved by summer school principal

#### **Program Course Changes:**

Requests for program course changes can be made within the first week of summer school. Program course changes after the first week of summer school are discouraged and must be arranged with the summer school staff.

#### **Program Fees:**

There may be minimal student fees charged to cover specific field trips or special materials. The fees are listed by each course in the booklet. The materials fee must be paid by the start of summer school.

# <u>Program Visitation by Students not Enrolled:</u> NO VISITORS WILL BE ALLOWED IN SUMMER SCHOOL FOR ANY REASON

#### **Bus Transportation:**

Bus transportation will be offered for the morning summer school sessions. Students will be picked up and dropped off at centralized locations determined by bus ridership and safety. If parents are concerned about safety, they should deliver their child(ren) to and from the centralized bus pick-up and drop-off locations, or provide alternative transportation. #### Field Trips:

Periodically students in some of the summer courses will be taking FIELD TRIPS. If such trips are of any distance or span a substantial time period, parents will be notified in advance of the field trip. A parent signature on the summer school enrollment form indicates parent permission for student field trip participation. If parents do not desire their child to participate in field trips, it should be noted in writing on the enrollment form.

#### Dress:

Students may dress casually but should always dress appropriately. Students need sturdy shoes that can be worn on the gym floor, out-of-doors or in classrooms. With that in mind, we recommend NO flip flops for summer school.

#### **Special Considerations:**

Under certain circumstances students will be allowed to take summer school courses outside of their designated grade level. The decision of the Summer School Principal is final.

#### **Conduct:**

Regular school year rules will be followed during the summer program. Students will be expected to go home when their instructional sessions end. If conduct is unbecoming, students will be dropped from the summer school program.

#### **Summer School Staff:**

All summer school programs will be taught, or supervised, by certified teachers. Efforts will be made to keep pupil-teacher ratios at a level that fosters opportunities for maximum pupil-teacher instructional interaction. When appropriate, qualified teacher aides will be hired to assist the professional staff.

#### Safety:

Safety protocols, as determined by the Cambridge Board Of Education, will be in place during summer school hours. Staff will review expectations with students for both indoor and outdoor learning environments.

Course Name	Swim Lessons Level 1
Course Description	Level 1 introduces basic aquatic skills, which participants continue to build on as they progress through Learn-to-Swim Levels. In addition, participants start developing positive attitudes, effective swimming habits and safe practices in and around the water. Level 1 skills may overlap with the Skippers 1 and Skippers 2 skills. Skills worked on in Level 1 include but are not limited to bobbing, submerging the face and blowing bubbles, gliding on the front and back, swimming on the front and back using arms and legs, and water safety. Recommended for 5 to 12 year olds. Prerequisites: No skill prerequisites.

Course Name	Swim Lessons Level 2
Course Description	The objective of Level 2 is to give participants success with fundamental skills. Many of the skills taught in this level are the similar skills taught in Skippers 3. This level marks the beginning of true locomotion skills. Participants learn to glide and float without support and recover to a vertical position. Participants further develop simultaneous and alternating arm and leg actions on the front and back, laying the foundation for future strokes. New water safety topics are introduced, and previously acquired water safety knowledge and skills are reinforced. Recommended for 5 to 12 year olds. Prerequisites: Successful completion of Level 1 and/or successful demonstration of the Level 1 exit skills, including entering the water independently, traveling 5 yards in the water, bobbing, gliding on the front, rolling to the back to float, and recovering to a vertical position. This is not a comprehensive list of skills needed to be prepared for Level 2, but rather a guide to help determine placement.

Course Name	Swim Lessons Level 3
Course Description	The objectives of Level 3 are to expand proficiency of previously learned skills by providing additional guided practice. Participants learn and practice survival floating and learn to swim front crawl and elementary backstroke at rudimentary proficiency levels. You introduce the scissors and dolphin kicks and extend the time duration for treading water. Participants also learn rules for headfirst entries and begin to learn to enter the headfirst from a seated position at poolside (if the water is 9 feet deep or deeper). New and previously addressed water safety topics are included. Recommended for 5 to 12 year olds.  Prerequisites: Successful completion of Level 2 and/or successful demonstration of the Level 2 exit skills including float or tread water for 15 seconds in chest-deep water, swim on front or back for 5 body lengths, transition from back float to front to vertical position, and push off and swim using combined leg and arm actions. This is not a comprehensive list of skills needed to be prepared for Level 3, but rather a guide to help determine placement.

Course Description	In Level 4, participants improve their aquatic skills and increase their endurance by swimming the strokes learned in Level 3 (i.e., front crawl, elementary backstroke) for greater distances and with more advanced proficiency. Participants add arm actions to the previously learned scissors kick and breaststroke kick to perform the rudimentary sidestroke and to learn the breaststroke. Participants also begin to learn the back crawl and butterfly, as well as the basics of performing a simple open turn at a wall, Recommended for 5 to 12 year olds.  Prerequisites: Successful completion of Level 3 and/or successful demonstration of the Level 3 exit skills including jumping into deep water and recovering to surface, treading or floating for one minute, and swimming front crawl and elementary backstroke for 25 yards. This is not a comprehensive list of skills needed to be prepared for Level 4, but rather a guide to help determine placement.

Participants also learn to perform flip turns on the front and back. Recommended for 5 to 12 year olds.  Prerequisites: Successful completion of Level 4 and/or successful demonstration of the Level 4 exit skills including swimming front crawl for 25 yards, changing direction and position as necessary and swimming elementary backstroke for 25 yards, backstroke for 15 yards, submerge and swim 3 to 5 body lengths underwater and safely returning to surface. This is not a comprehensive list of skills needed to be prepared for Level 5, but rather a guide to help determine placement.
